A visit to Thunder Mesa (Frontierland) in Disneyland Paris. It has the best backstory of any themed land and it houses my Disneyland Paris favorites; Big Thunder Mountain (on an island where you get to via dark tunnels at high speed!) and Phantom manor (the Paris version of the Haunted Mansion). Be sure to do some online research about Thunder Mesa to discover how everything connects in Thunder Mesa.
