In 2011, I was diagnosed with Parkinson's disease and carried on working until 2021 when I retired due to ill health. On my retirement from teaching, I decided to focus on my love for Disney and help people enjoy the parks and Disney cruises who are in a wheelchair like myself. I became an InsidEar for Disneyland Paris 4 weeks ago.

Home park is Disneyland Paris and have been going since 1995 so have seen a lot of changes over the years. I have also been on two Disney cruises sailing from the UK and have another booked in September 2023. My ambition is to visit all the Disney sites in the world but due to my health I can't fly at the moment.

Q 04 | THE FORMAT

Tell us something about the format of your online platform(s), how it all started, which Disney Parks you cover, and why you love to put such a lot of effort in those activities.

My passion is helping other people really enjoy Disneyland Paris in wheelchairs. I am unable to transfer out of my chair onto rides so have to find other ways to enjoy the parks. I cover this using photos and video clips on Instagram and Facebook daily as well as sharing old photos from the park when it first opened. I also give advice on the food in the parks. I also write about my experiences on Disney cruises and life in concierge and whether the luxury Disney life is worth it.

Q 05 | THE LOVE

How and when did your love for Disney Parks start?

I often wanted to go to the American parks when I was younger as I loved the Disney films. I also watched Walt himself in his programmes and fell in love with his vision and enthusiasm. It just did not happen when I was younger as my parents could not afford it so I had to wait until Disneyland Paris opened in 1995 to first visit a park.

How many times/days a year do you visit Disney Parks (estimate)? And how many days are most of your trips?

We go twice a year and go for 5 nights stay. We always stay at the Disneyland Hotel.

"Mickey and the Magician" is the best show but I also loved the "Jungle Book Jive" in 2019. My favourite rides are "It's a Small World", "Phantom Manor" and on the "Molly Brown" riverboat.

I have two. Watching the "Jungle Book Jive" as Goofy led his army of Indian drummers marching through the castle out onto the castle stages. It was just the wall of sound and the colourful spectacle that hit you and made you dance. I was sat there doing my best to dance in my wheelchair to the wonderful sounds. My second is the first time I went to the park after being in my wheelchair. My husband left me sat in Main Street whilst he nipped into City Hall. I suddenly had 5 Cast Members come over and check I was ok and if they could help me in anyway. I cried as they were so kind and gave me lots of tips how to enjoy the parks in my wheelchair. They were true magic!

Do you have a tip or advise - about anything Disney Parks related - to share with our readers?

Stay in a Disney hotel to be totally immersed in the magic and get a meal plan so you can try all the wonderful restaurants. You can manage your budget better then.
